<p>School Based Apprenticeship and Traineeship (SBAT) and RTO Selection criteria</p>	<p>School based students undertaking the CPC30211 Certificate III in Carpentry will do so via a School Based Apprenticeship and Traineeship (SBAT).</p> <p>Course applicants must meet the following selection criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be aged 15 years or older; • be enrolled in a VCE or VCAL program, and • complete a language, literacy and numeracy assessment to a satisfactory level.
<p>Course Structure and Duration</p>	<p>The course is completed over 3 years / 6 semesters, and will require attendance at one day per week.</p> <p>The CPC30211 Certificate III in Carpentry course requires students to attend scheduled classes at Parade College (1 day per week) and undertake an on the job work placement (1 day per week).</p>
<p>Training and assessment methods, and locations</p>	<p>Scheduled Classes:</p> <p>Scheduled classes will be conducted at Parade College, Bundoora Campus. Training methods include face to face, classroom based trainer led presentations and demonstrations. Students will have significant</p>

	<p>opportunities to develop practical skills in carpentry, with trainer coaching and supervision.</p> <p>During the course you will also have the opportunity to apply your carpentry knowledge and skills via practical projects. These sessions will be conducted at the College's onsite training facilities.</p> <p>On the job/Work based placement:</p> <p>Students undertaking the CPC30211 training course and as part of the SBAT will undertake one day per week on the job with a nominated employer. Parade College staff will assist students to identify and engage with a suitable employer.</p> <p>Assessment:</p> <p>A range of assessment methods are used throughout the course including workbook activities, written tests and practical skill demonstrations. You will receive detailed assessment information on commencement of each unit.</p>
Course Schedule	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • College Based - Thursdays 8.00 am – 4.30 pm • Work Based – 1 day (8 hours) as negotiated with employer
Course requirements	<p>During orientation you will be informed of any specialist clothing, footwear, equipment or materials required of the course.</p>
RPL	<p>Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises the knowledge and skills you have gained through previous informal training, and past work and life experience.</p> <p>If you think that you might be able to apply for RPL, talk to Mr Mckay, Executive Officer - RTO, preferably before course commencement.</p>
Further Training and Employment Pathways	<p>Further Training:</p> <p>After achieving CPC30211, graduates may undertake a range of carpentry related units and qualifications including CPC40611 Certificate IV in Building and Construction (Specialist Trades).</p> <p>Employment:</p> <p>After achieving CPC30211, graduates may gain employment as a carpenter.</p>
