Unit Code and Title	<p>CPCOHS1001A Work safely in the construction industry</p> <p>Also known within the building and construction industry as a White Card or Construction Industry (CI) Card.</p>
About the course	<p>This unit of competency will provide you with the essential OHS knowledge and skills to work in a range of construction sites.</p> <p>The unit is a WorkSafe Victoria mandatory requirement for any person working on a building or construction site.</p> <p><i>On satisfactory completion of this unit, Parade College will on your behalf apply and pay for an industry recognised WorkSafe Victoria Construction Induction Card.</i></p>
RTO Selection criteria	<p>Course applicants must meet the following selection criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • minimum 16 years of age at course commencement • satisfactory completion of Year 9 secondary school studies or higher, and • satisfactory completion of a language, literacy and numeracy test.
Course Duration and Schedule	<p>Duration:</p> <p>The course is completed in a 1 day (6 hour) workshop.</p> <p>Schedule:</p> <p>Contact Parade College for the next scheduled program.</p>
Location of training	<p>Training will be conducted at the Edmund Rice Trade Training Centre at Parade College.</p>
Training methods	<p>Training methods include a combination of trainer led presentations and student practical skills development with trainer coaching and supervision.</p>
Assessment methods	<p>Assessment methods conducted during the workshop include workbook activities and a written test. You will receive detailed assessment information on commencement of the workshop.</p>

Course requirements	Prior to workshop commencement you will be informed of any specialist clothing, footwear, equipment or materials required of the course.
RPL	Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises the knowledge and skills you have gained through previous informal training, and past work and life experience. If you think that you might be able to apply for RPL, talk to Mr Anthony McKay, (Executive Officer RTO) preferably before workshop commencement.
Learning and Employment Pathways	Learning: After achieving CPCCOHS1001A, graduates may undertake a range of building and construction related units and qualifications, including CPC30111 Certificate III in Building and Construction. Employment: After achieving CPCCOHS1001A, graduates will have OHS/WHS clearance to enter and/or work on a building and construction site.
