<b>Course Duration and Schedule</b>	<p><b>Duration:</b></p> <p>The course is completed over 2 years / 4 semesters, and will require attendance at one half day session per week.</p> <p><b>Schedule:</b></p> <p>Mondays 7.30 am – 1.00pm  Tuesdays 12.00 md – 5.00pm  Wednesdays 7.30 am – 1.00pm</p>
<b>Location of training</b>	Training will be conducted at Parade College, Bundoora Campus.
<b>Training and assessment methods</b>	<p><b>Training methods</b></p> <p>Training methods include a combination of teacher led presentations and demonstrations, and student practical skills development with coaching and supervision by your teacher.</p> <p>During the course you will also have the opportunity to apply your plumbing knowledge and skills via practical projects.</p>
	<p><b>Assessment methods</b></p> <p>A range of assessment methods are used throughout the course including workbook activities, written tests and practical skill demonstrations. You will receive detailed assessment information on commencement of each unit.</p>
<b>Course requirements</b>	During orientation you will be informed of any specialist clothing, footwear, equipment or materials required of the course.
<b>RPL</b>	<p>Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises the knowledge and skills you have gained through previous informal training, and past work and life experience.</p> <p>If you think that you might be able to apply for RPL, talk to the Director of Trade and Training preferably before course commencement.</p>
