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<b>Qualification Code and Title</b>	MSF20516 Certificate II in Furniture Making Pathways
<b>About the course</b>	<p>This qualification will provide you with an opportunity to gain beginning level knowledge and skills required to manufacture free-standing furniture or built-in cabinets, and to provide on-site assistance in the installation of furniture or cabinets.</p> <p>The completion of this course in a senior secondary environment has many benefits including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• assisting you to decide if you are suited to a trade career;</li> <li>• being the preferred pathway of many construction sector employers when employing apprentices to complete Certificate III qualifications, and</li> <li>• providing useful skills for future domestic/D.I.Y projects.</li> </ul>

<b>Course Duration and Schedule</b>	<p><b>Duration:</b></p> <p>The course is completed over 2 years / 4 semesters, and will require attendance at one half day session per week.</p> <p><b>Schedule:</b></p> <p>You can choose to attend one of the follow sessions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mondays 7.30 am – 1.00pm</li> <li>• Tuesdays 12.00 md – 5.00pm</li> <li>• Wednesdays 7.30 am – 1.00pm</li> </ul>
<b>Location of training</b>	<p>Training will be conducted at Parade College, Bundoora Campus.</p>
<b>Training and assessment methods</b>	<p><b>Training methods</b></p> <p>Training methods include a combination of trainer led presentations and demonstrations, and student practical skills development with trainer coaching and supervision.</p> <p>During the course you will also have the opportunity to apply your plumbing knowledge and skills via practical projects.</p> <p><b>Assessment methods</b></p> <p>A range of assessment methods are used throughout the course including workbook activities, written tests and practical skill demonstrations. You will receive detailed assessment information on commencement of each unit.</p>
<b>Course requirements</b>	<p>During orientation you will be informed of any specialist clothing, footwear, equipment or materials required of the course.</p>

<b>RPL</b>	<p>Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises the knowledge and skills you have gained through previous informal training, and past work and life experience.</p> <p>If you think that you might be able to apply for RPL, talk to Mr A McKay, Director of Trade and Training, preferably before course commencement.</p>
<b>Learning and Employment Pathways</b>	<p><b>Learning:</b> After achieving MSF20516, graduates may undertake a range of furnishing, building and construction related units and qualifications, including MSF30213 Certificate III in Furniture Making.</p> <p><b>Employment:</b> After achieving MSF20516, graduates may commence an apprenticeship in the building and construction industry.</p>
