Altior is a challenging academic program that extends and enriches Year 7 to Year 9 students in the core subject areas of English, Humanities, Science and Mathematics.

Altior is aimed at students who are highly motivated and have an excellent work ethic. Year 7 Altior is open to Year 6 students enrolled at Parade College.

Entry into Year 8 and 9 Altior is via offer, based on a selection criteria that includes students' academic results, NAPLAN, teacher

recommendation, external testing and College participation.

Depending upon their academic results, Altior students may be offered acceleration into VCE Units 1 and 2 in Year 10 and VCE Units 3 and 4 in Year 11.
