School TV - A Special Report: Gambling and Young People

Today's generation of children and adolescents face a unique and concerning environment regarding gambling. They are growing up in a digital age characterised by constant connectivity, where the gambling industry has evolved significantly during their formative years.

With smartphones and social media platforms at their fingertips, the line between gambling and entertainment has blurred, particularly within the realms of video games and social media.

Even with legal restrictions in place, a considerable number of teenagers are engaging in online gambling, a trend facilitated by the industry's normalisation of betting practices on the internet. Research consistently highlights that a significant percentage of adolescents are involved in gambling activities, and some experience adverse consequences such as diminished academic performance and strained relationships.

The digital era has made gambling more accessible, and certain factors elevate the risk of problematic gambling among young individuals, particularly those who already engage in risky behaviours like alcohol consumption.

Simulated gambling in video games can further increase the likelihood of teenagers transitioning to real - money gambling and developing future gambling - related problems.

To navigate children through responsible online gaming and gambling, it's imperative for parents and caregivers to foster open discussions about media choices. Encouraging a balanced approach to screen time, promoting alternative activities for stress relief and boredom, and setting clear family rules for screen and internet use, including establishing spending limits for online gambling and in - game purchases, can empower children to make informed and responsible decisions in this digital age.

Greensborough Station Multi - Deck and Bus Interchange Project

The College received communication last week from a level crossing removal crossing contractor. The below information was communicated to all families via email and in the Student Bulletin each day.

Major building works are underway, the project will be complete by the end of the year.

To ensure all our students that travel near Greensborough Station are safe, pedestrians cannot use the western pedestrian path on Flintoff Street between Para Road and the Greensborough Medical Centre (next to their construction site).

Banyule Council contacted the company to inform them that some students have been walking up Flintoff Street on the road next to live traffic, instead of using the signalised pedestrian crossing to walk up the eastern pedestrian path.

If your child uses this route, please advise him to use the



signalised crossing and walk up eastern pedestrian path on Flintoff Street to ensure their safety.

The company's aim is to minimise disruptions where possible and they recognise that current disruption is not convenient for pedestrians trying to access public transport and the shops. They are currently reviewing this disruption to see where improvements can be made.



Just as a musician or sportsperson improves their skills through practice, students should work on identifying the areas they have mastered and focus on improving those that need further development.

Please note that Monday 10 June is the day of the King's Birthday Public Holiday.


All students are required to wear their correct full school uniform for all exams. Sport uniforms may not be worn except by those involved in ACC Sport on the day of the exam.

Year 10 and 11 students are required to attend school for only the times of their exams plus 30 minutes prior. There will be no Tutor Group on these days for Year 10 and 11 students. Unless in an examination at the same time, and student acceleration in a Unit 3 and 4 subject is required to attend their regular timetabled Unit 3 and 4 class.

Study halls will be available in the NLC for any student remaining at school during normal school hours. If a student does not attend a Year 10 or 11 examination, if possible, it will be rescheduled only for approved school events (for example ACC Sport) or upon presentation of a medical certificate.

Some of the students who were in attendance recount the presentation below.

Beyond Blue speaker and ambassador Leon joined some of the Year 11 and 12 students and teachers to discuss his battle with depression and anxiety. Leon had an incredible career in Education, serving as a Vice-Principal before becoming a Principal, serving in these roles for many years.

After retiring, Leon's lifestyle changed drastically, evolving from a very high stress career to a relaxed retirement. After

retiring, Leon unfortunately developed cancer, which he believes was a major contributor to his mental health struggles.

It was a privilege to attend with many other students and teachers and hear such an inspiring story about how he learnt to understand that, as a man, it is okay to be vulnerable. He attributes a lot of his rehabilitation success to the support of his wife, stressing the importance of making and keeping valuable connections in times when we need support.

Leon provided insight into the various symptoms that people suffering from anxiety or depression may display and how we can spot it in a friend, family member, colleague, or loved one. Leon was an excellent speaker, with his openness about this transformative time in his life, leaving much thought for all who attended to take away.

Initially, I was a bit apprehensive about approaching the topic of mental health since the topic can be serious. However, I felt that my apprehensiveness was unneeded due to how approachable Leon made himself regarding his story and the general facts behind mental illnesses such as depression and anxiety.

Leon Sinnott showed us that mental illnesses are like physical illnesses, and it's something that we shouldn't stigmatise because we need support to overcome any challenge.

Going to this presentation has opened my eyes to the need for change in the discussion of mental health because it is just as important as physical health. One step at a time, all of us can learn how to appropriately tackle challenges like these. Thimira Wijesinghe Year 12 L05
